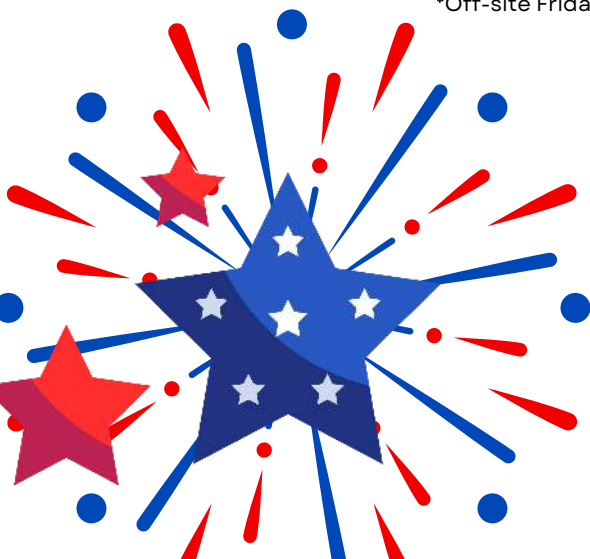

Registration Procedures

- Advance registration is required for all camps and sessions.
- Class level is determined by which grade the child will enter at the start of the 2026–27 academic school year.
- Students in kindergarten may register for half-day or full-day.
 - If registering for half a day, students must be picked up during the break time.
- Students in grades 1–8 may register for one, two, or three periods per session.
 - If registering for periods that are not consecutive, children must be picked up at 12:30 p.m.
- Late pickups will be charged for the next period.
- You may register for the one-week Cougar Camps or Cougar Paws Fridays in addition to your sessions or as stand-alone experiences.
- Extended care is available at an additional cost, either per session or per day.
- Late registration will be accepted if space permits.
- Payments may be made online only.
- The registration form, contact information, and full payment are required to complete registration.

Additional Information

Daily Routine

Attendance is taken at the beginning of each class period. Students should arrive on time and be prepared for the start of each class period. The entrance gate will be locked during program hours and unlocked during each arrival and dismissal period.

Extended Care

Extended care is available both in the morning and afternoon. Daily extended care can be arranged at a rate of \$40 per child. All extended care must be paid for in advance. Same-day care must be paid for at drop-off. Children not picked up by 6:00 p.m. will incur a late fee at the rate of \$1/minute.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Please drop off and pick up students in the semicircle at the front of the school. The front gate will be unlocked and staffed during recess times for those students who are leaving and arriving. The gate will be locked during class time and unlocked at lunch time, during which children will be supervised. If the gate is locked, you may use the front office to enter the grounds. If you plan to walk your child onto campus, please use the Magnolia Park parking lot and do not park in the loop.

Lunch and Snacks

Students are responsible for providing their own lunch or snack. We have partnered with Cater Tots to offer a hot-lunch program. Please visit CaterTots.com for instructions on how to order online and use our school code CAV267. Make note of their strict ordering guidelines. Children enrolled in the morning classes are welcome to stay for the lunch period at no extra charge. Children enrolled for the afternoon classes are welcome to arrive at the lunch period at no extra charge.

A variety of snacks, drinks, and frozen treats is available for purchase (\$1/each) at Betty's Bistro on campus.

Attire

Casual and comfortable clothing is best for summer. Sneakers are required for safety. Children participating in Friday activities are required to wear their summer program T-shirt.

Holidays

Summer program includes two Cougar Camps and three sessions that include four days of instructional classes per week, typically held Monday–Thursday. CAVS observes all federal holidays and will be closed on Friday, June 19, 2026 and Friday, July 3, 2026.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be made after the canceled session has ended. Cancellation notice of one week or more will incur a 20% fee. Cancellation notice of less than one week will incur a 50% fee.

Our Faculty

Our summer faculty includes many teachers who work with us during the regular school year as well as adjunct teachers who are recommended to us. All teachers are Carden trained or certified in their field.

Our Facilities

Our campus is located at the intersection of San Antonio Avenue and 15th Street in Upland. Although we are not affiliated, we share our site with Upland Christian Church. The school backs up to Magnolia Park, which we frequently use during our summer session. Our well-maintained grounds boast a variety of mature trees, and our campus is secured with locked, coded gates.

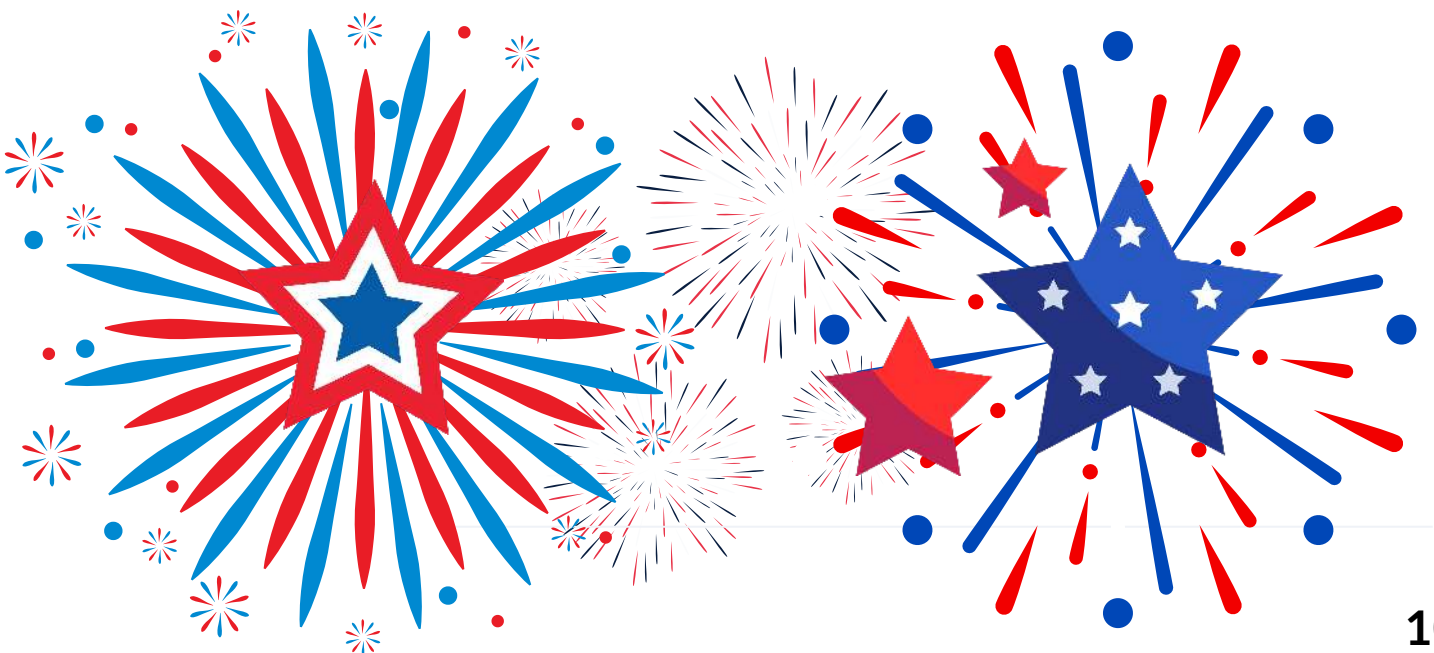

Descriptions

- Students work on reading, comprehension, spelling, and vowel chart awareness. They will expand their oral language skills and gain meaningful vocabulary.
- Students learn to care for living plants over time by checking soil moisture, adjusting watering habits, and maintaining the growing area through weeding and thinning. Students monitor plant health and learn to recognize early signs of common issues such as pests, leaf stress, and nutrient problems. The focus is on building good routines and learning how to respond early so the garden stays strong and plants continue to develop.
- Math is everywhere. In this class you will apply the basic concepts of math—including addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, and decimals—and a variety of artistic styles to create your own works of art. Put your math and art skills to the test and become an Arithmetical Artist.
- Become a more careful and elegant writer as you learn to interpret short stories and poetry. Make sense of figurative language and rhetorical devices. This class helps to develop skills for more advanced literature and writing classes in high school and beyond.

Lessons focus on color theory, brush control, layering, and visual storytelling, with inspiration drawn from artists, nature, and personal imagination.

Scratch Game and Project Building

- This introductory Scratch course teaches students to design and build the core elements needed to create interactive games and projects. Learners will explore sprites, backgrounds, events, loops, conditionals, variables, and simple animations while practicing problem-solving and creative thinking. By the end of the course, students will confidently combine these elements to design their own original Scratch games and projects.

Tea and Tai Chi

- Learn a variety of mind/body relaxation techniques to help you focus throughout your day. Listen to ancient Chinese flute music as you sample herbal teas and learn the simple movements of tai chi, qi gong, and body tapping to leave you feeling both energized and relaxed. Pair this class with Mrs. Beeson’s “Creative Illustration” to illustrate and publish your story.

It’s Not Just Art, It’s Crafting Grades 1–8 Mrs. Barbara Ghali	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In this hands-on art class, students will explore creativity through a variety of paper-based and mixed-media projects. Using paper and other craft materials, students will develop fine motor skills, artistic expression, and design thinking while creating projects such as a bear weaving design, memory journal, salt painting, foam stamping, a 3D paper lion collage, pop-up card, tissue paper sun catcher, and a posable toucan. This course encourages imagination, experimentation, and confidence in making art while learning foundational techniques in texture, layering, and construction.
Minecraft Coding and Commands Grades 3–8 Mr. Kyle Bagdasarian (Maximum 12 students)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Students will learn beginner-friendly “coding” inside Minecraft by using commands, creative tools, and simple redstone systems to make cool things happen. Each session includes a fun mini-project like building an obstacle course, making a teleport challenge, creating a “capture the flag” arena, or designing a simple game with rules. Students will practice logic, problem-solving, and teamwork while learning how game systems work behind the scenes. Great for both beginners and students who already love Minecraft. Everyone will have something to build, improve, and share.

- This class is all about creating awesome digital designs students are proud of. Students will design "clean and professional" posters, graphics, and creative projects while learning skills like color choice, layout, and font style. Projects may include sports posters, sticker-style designs, mini-slideshows, simple animations, and digital artwork challenges. Students get freedom to be creative, but also learn real design rules that make their work pop.

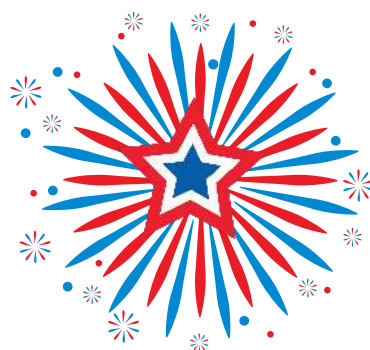

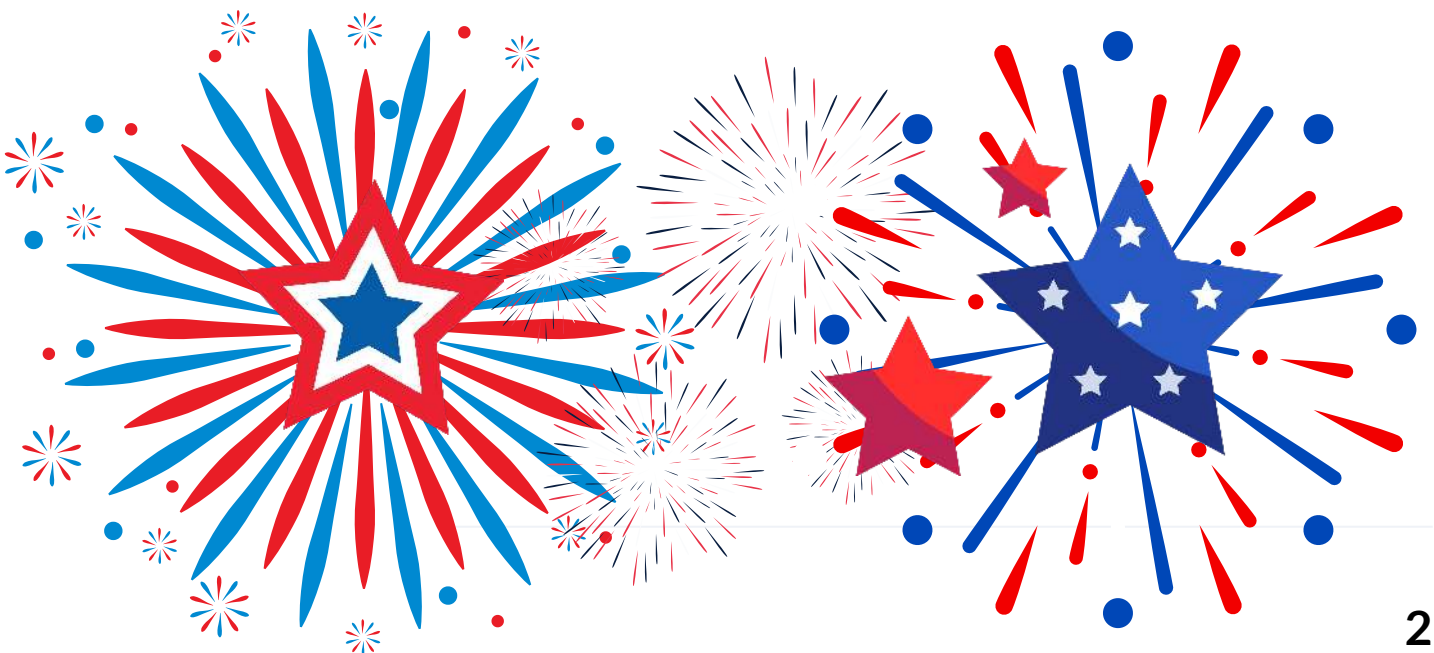
